META-PRENEUR: Think Differently is an enterprise education pilot running across three Scottish colleges Edinburgh College, Forth Valley College, and West Lothian College.

In West Lothian, we are working with students studying Automotive (Level 4), Electrical Installation (Level 5), and ESOL, we use the Skills Development Scotland Meta-Skills 4.0 framework to help young people develop the entrepreneurial and intrapreneurial mindset that employers genuinely value.

We are now looking for third sector partners charities, social enterprises, and community organisations who are willing to get involved in a straightforward, flexible, and genuinely rewarding way.

What We Are Asking For

There are two ways to get involved — you can choose one or both:

1 | Share Your Story

Come into class (or join online) and talk to students about your organisation. We'd love you to share:

- The problem or community need you identified
- What made you decide to do something about it
- What has gone well and lessons learned
- What keeps you going — and what advice you'd give

Students will be able to ask you questions. Your experience is exactly what they need to hear.

2 | Bring a Real Challenge

Give students a genuine problem your organisation is facing. This could be something specific to your field, or a broader organisational challenge, for example:

- Recruiting and retaining volunteers
- Improving your social media or online presence
- Developing community engagement ideas
- Starting a new project or initiative

Students may not always deliver a perfect solution but they will bring fresh perspectives and new thinking that could genuinely help move you forward.
